COURSE OVERVIEW

The recent developments of internet technology have improved access to medical information and evidence that is necessary for improving patient care services in developing countries. The internet is popularized with current and comprehensive medical information and research, however one needs to be competent on how to find, share and critically appraise this knowledge. The present workshop focuses on building the capacity of faculty, clinicians, librarians, ICT experts, and health care professionals to acquire skills in evidence based medicine, information search, retrieval, and sharing in electronic formats in Tanzania

THE WORKSHOP

This three-day workshop will introduce you to evidence based practice and critical appraisal techniques and equip you with skills in using web 2.0 tools to enhance and improve evidence based health care, collaborative work and knowledge sharing within your organization and with stakeholders, and increase the level of innovation within your organisation.

WORKSHOP VENUE

The venue of the workshop is Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences, Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

COURSE CONTENT AND STRUCTURE

The workshop will be conducted over three days (26-28 August 2014). The workshop will comprise lectures delivered in a classroom setting, hands-on exercises, group work and individual practical work on the following:

- Introduction: what is evidence-based healthcare, and why is it important?
- ASK: the importance of research questions in evidence-based healthcare
- Behind the numbers: understanding healthcare statistics; science, speed and the search for best evidence
- Making sense of results
- ACQUIRE: searching for healthcare information
- Turning evidence into practice
- Introduction to Information Self Service and selected Web 2.0 tools

PARTICIPATION

The course is open to researchers, lecturers, library and information professionals, health care professionals, and graduate students from institutions involved in medical and health sciences. Specifically, participants are expected to come from relevant government ministries, Non-Governmental Organizations, universities and faculties of medical and health sciences. The language of instruction is English. No basic computer and internet modules will be covered during the workshop.

FUNDING AND FINANCE

This course is supported and funded by Elsevier Foundation. The sponsorship for successful applicants will cover the cost of registration, light refreshments and lunches for each participant. A small allowance to cover the accommodation costs shall be given to participants from outside Dar es salaam.
